Green's Windmill & Science Centre





Green's Windmill is a restored and working 19th Century tower mill. Built in 1807 by the father of celebrated scientist and mathematician George Green, it is the only city-based working windmill in the UK. In 2013, the Green's Windmill Trust (charity no.1163116) took over the running of the windmill from Nottingham City Council, and today is reliant on volunteers to help keep the windmill open and operational for the enjoyment of others.

Many types of flour are still produced at the mill and tours can be taken to see the mill in action. In the interactive Science Centre visitors can discover the remarkable story of George Green, and experiment with light, electricity and magnetism. A community garden adjacent to the windmill also opened in 2016 and is a great addition to the site. Baking and craft events take place all year round for both the public and private group bookings. School groups visit all year round too, whilst children's birthday parties are a popular feature.
